CPR revision for the construction sector: Our challenges



Efficient standardisation: the proposed mandatory and voluntary standards & implementing and delegated acts will create a **more complex, burdensome process**



Clear scope: the proposal should solely focus on construction products



Product & technology neutrality to be preserved: the CPR delivers a common technical language to assess the performance of construction products, without distinction.

CPR revision for the construction sector: Our solutions



CPR only to be applied to products that are placed on the market



CE marking to be maintained & strengthened, also for innovative products without hENs



Standardisation delivery through improved coordination between EC, Member States & CEN



Linking CPR to building requirements will allow authorities and private clients to select solutions that best fit their needs.



Digitalisation as supporting tool, formalise use of machine-readable formats



Environmental data delivery through inclusion of existing and value-chain approved EPDs
